In honor of Independence Day, it seems only natural to recommend American wines that outperform for the price. These range from \$9 to \$18, including an exceptional California cabernet sauvignon, rivaled by a red blend from New York, a zesty rosé from Virginia and a delightful Riesling from Idaho. Cue the orchestra for "America the Beautiful."

Boxwood Estate Rosé 2011



Virginia, \$15

Boxwood is known for its red Bordeaux-style blends and has made a rosé of cabernet franc "bled" off the grapes during fermentation. In 2011, wine maker Adam McTaggart made what I call an "intentional" rosé, picking his malbec grapes early with high acidity and treating them like a white wine, and then blending in some juice siphoned off the other red varieties. The result is the best Boxwood rosé yet and one of the best produced locally.
